I have been the attending physician for [REDACTED] date of birth [REDACTED], for a number of years. As a result of ongoing orthopedic issues related to significant prior history of trauma, I would recommend the following work-related accommodations:

1. Please allow Mr. [REDACTED] to use personal audio equipment such as an iPod. He uses this as a means of distracting himself from movement-related pain.
2. Patient may utilize utility carts as a means of stabilization when walking. Similarly, he may also use something to similar to the Rubbermaid Brute 44 trash barrel for the same effect.
3. Please allow him to use a wet string mop and bucket with wringer rather than a microfiber pad mop assembly. The former causes less strain.
4. Please allow the patient to utilize hospital scrub wear. The cotton blend causes less skin sensitivity than the regular issue [REDACTED] garments which tend to irritate his skin.
