Sometime in the early 1980's I was made aware of an obscure Bible teacher by the name of Chuck Missler. He held forth from Calvary Chapel Cost Mesa (Chuck Smith, Pastor). I was informed by a brother who was associated with the Seattle Calvary Chapel (meeting at Lincoln High School) that one could obtain free tapes of his teachings from an outfit called Firefighters For Christ.

The brother spoke somewhat matter-of-factly concerning these tapes and the teachings, as if one ought to have already known about the teacher and that it was commonplace for a "Calvary Chapelite" to have already been made aware of Missler and his teachings. I must have been way out in the woods or something because I had never before heard of Missler, or Firefighters For Christ.

Anyway, he gave me a FFC brochure from which I ordered some tapes and listened, and really liked what I heard. I especially was drawn to his teaching on the Mazzaroth, or Zodiac, because all I had ever heard about the Zodiac was that it was occultic and evil. Now I had been exposed to a reasonable teaching that stated the Zodiac, or Mazzaroth, was actually the Gospel story being told in the star constellations.

What a revelation. But it really got me to thinking about what I had been taught in Sunday School, and how I had been taught, and made me question whether there were other things I didn't know, or knew inaccurately.

So I credit the Lord, who led me to a Bible Teacher that loved the truth enough to break with "church social convention", and was willing to drill down past erroneous biblical traditions, into the Heart of the Word and find out "that which really is" (Webster's definition of "truth"), all in accordance with Scripture.

And as I stated earlier, I have listened to all of Missler's Bible studies, and all but a few of his briefing packs.
