Why I Believe In Bible Codes

Dear Dan,

Dr. Chuck Missler has done a remarkable work in identifying various codes in Scripture that could only have been put there by the Holy Spirit while it was being written. Even though I have listened extensively to the audio versions of the studies, because of the complexity of the explanations of the codes, my limited retained knowledge will only suffice to refer the reader to Dr. Missler's works found at www.khouse.org (see Store).

But something happened to me many years ago that supports the notion of the Lord having put discoverable codes in His Book that authenticate His Word.

In about 1998, one of the founding members (CB30) of the Church (U1) passed away, leaving his former wife and children. (M) and I attended his memorial service, and I was able to say a few things during the open microphone part of the meeting.

A few days after going to the service the thought occurred to me to write a letter to (CB30)'s son and daughter. I had compassion for them, since I had known their parents before they were born. So, when I had time I wrote a short one page letter expressing my thoughts and prayers. It was in a smaller, 10 point font so I was able to fit more paragraphs on the page (the Letters To Daniel have all been 12 point Cambria font).

After I printed out the letter, I reviewed it for spelling, accuracy, etc. Then I noticed something unusual. I looked again and again, and had a "Whiskey Tango Foxtrot" moment to myself.

I noticed that if I read just the first word of each paragraph, they made a complete sentence that BY ITSELF was a unique message of encouragement. Only one or two words were missing that could easily be inferred by any reader with the most basic english skills; words like "a", "the", or "and".

I looked again and again, and wondered. And this happened many years before I knew about anything about Bible Codes.

But wait, there's more...

Did you know there are 66 books of the Bible (not counting all the Living Epistles) penned by forty authors?

And that there are 66 Chapters in the Book of Isaiah?*

And that there are 66 Letters in Volume One of Letters To Daniel?

Question is; by what means or mechanism did the letter to my friend's offspring contain an easily seen "code" in it?

And how in the world did LTD-V1 come up with only 66 letters in it, especially since I did such a hatchet job on the numbering scheme? I had no plan at all when I started. Things just came together, the plan being developed as I wrote.

Do the readers have any guesses?

Or, like me, do you have knowledge for fact-certain?
