The Book of Genesis
Chapter 14

The Book of Joshua

Chapter 15

Verses 5 Through 8

The east border was the Salt Sea as far as the mouth of the Jordan. And the border on the northern quarter began at the bay of the sea at the mouth of the Jordan. The border went up to Beth Hoglah and passed north of Beth Arabah; and the border went up to the stone of Bohan the son of Reuben. The fortress also will cease from Ephraim,

The Book of Matthew
Chapter 13
Verses 24 Through 30
