The WWII Anointing

Dear Dan,

This month, December 2014, on Tuesday the 16th, the seventieth anniversary of the start of the Battle of the Bulge will be remembered. While I knew of the decisive battle from WW2, I was not aware of the anniversary date when earlier this month I had purchased an audio book by Bill O'Reilly titled "Killing Patton" and listened to it at work. A day or two later, after listening to an episode of Coast to Coast AM with George Noory, I was reminded that the anniversary date was in the month of December.

A day or two after this while at work I was thinking about the book I had just listened to, and how the Lord had led me to include an audio quote from the movie Patton, starring George C. Scott, in one of the letters to you that I had voice recorded. Specifically it is attached to Letter 67 at the beginning, which also happens to be the first letter of Volume 2.

While I was remembering the Patton's prayer part of Letter 67, I started to get emotional, and after a few seconds I realized that the emotions I was feeling were not my own, but coming from one of my angelic family members.

After asking, angel Gabriel said that he was the one getting choked up. I asked why, and he said that it was because it was he that had taken the prayer from the Chaplain up to God, just after the Chaplain had received it from the Holy Spirit, and as I write this he states that he also brought back the answer to General Patton.

Here is the prayer that General Patton had printed on a Christmas Card and then distribute to all his men in the Third Army on 8 December 1944.

"Almighty and most merciful Father, we humbly beseech Thee, of Thy great goodness, to restrain these immoderate rains with which we have had to contend. Grant us fair weather for Battle. Graciously hearken to us as soldiers who call upon Thee that, armed with Thy power, we may advance from victory to victory, and crush the oppression and wickedness of our enemies and establish Thy justice among men and nations."

But there is something else that stands out with me. Whenever my family would visit Grandma and Grandpa in Astoria, I remember having a funny feeling after getting settled in at their apartment. Now as I write, I think the best way to articulate this would be that I felt a subtle sense of being awe-struck.

I have thought about this before the Lord for many years, and lately the only description I can come up with for how I felt is to call it The World War Two anointing. It was this anointing that Jesus poured out upon all the Servicemen that helped conquer the Nazis and free the Jews during WW2. Grandpa had served in the Navy during WW2.
