One Small Error Makes For A Happy Janitor

Dear **Jesus**,

Friday, 30 November 2018, was to be my last scheduled work-day (G6). I had applied for and been approved to take vacation time for the week of 3 - 7 December, which is my last week of employment at (G6), after which I will have been retired from active employment. The ninth is my final day of being an active employee at the Hospital (G6), after 17 years and 6 months. My hire date was 17 July 2001.

I had taken Thursday off as an unscheduled absence due to higher than normal pain issues. But I went to work Friday with the thought of putting in my final shift, cleaning up my janitor's closet and cart, and saying, "Goodbye" to select individuals.

As I arrived and went to the Environmental Room where the pagers and check-in sheet are kept, I saw another co-worker who was going to the same room. We said "hello", and then as we walked together he said something that surprised me. He said he was there to work for me, since I was not scheduled to be there.

With some surprise, I saw on the two week roster that, sure enough, there on the sheet was the entry which said I was scheduled to take Friday off, as the beginning of my last vacation.

I picked up the phone and called the Department Manager. He explained that the Night Supervisor had made an error on the scheduling roster. I informed him that if he approved, I would be happy to take Friday off as well anyway. He said that he had planned on a small celebration with some cake and punch at start of shift. I responded that I would be willing to stay for that, after which I would depart. He approved.

I had gotten to work an hour early, like I had always done, so I went upstairs and proceeded to clean out my janitor's cart and closet.

After getting all my stuff out of the closet and into my car, I went to the Manager's Office and turned in my ID Card-key Badge and Utility Keys.

Before the party started, I was able to deliver some cards to those individuals I had worked closely with over the years, and to one young man, a new hire, who I had learned was a Believer. I gave him some discs with Kingdom Equipment recorded thereon, and instructed him to:

"GUARD THESE WITH YOUR LIFE".

And so I will have come to the end of the longest tenure of employment to another which I have had to date, ending at 11:59:59 hours Pacific Time, on Sunday, 9 December 2018.

Beginning at Midnight, the 10th of December 2018, I will be reporting directly to You, and receive Your instructions from the Lord Holy Spirit.

A New Day, dedicated to the Heart of The Son (HOTS).

But for this next week, I'm just going to have some serious R&R.
